EL 226: English for Import-Export Business
Course Outline
Semester 1/2019**

Pre-requisite: EL 172 or TU 105

Course Description:

This course aims to broaden and enhance student perspectives of the import-export business through development and practice of English language skills related to the field. The course content includes major topics relevant to import-export business including Currency Exchange, International Organizations, Border Trade, Copyright and Intellectual Property, Containerization, and Electronic Commerce as a Growing Worldwide Trend. Students will furthermore increase their proficiency in reading and writing English business documents specific to the import-export business.

Learning Outcomes:

In terms of the English language learning, upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. improve vocabulary and reading skills
2. construct import-export business related writing tasks
3. demonstrate grammatical competency in import-export business communication
4. develop listening skills with in-class listening practices and assignments
5. build on and exhibits professional oral and presentation skills

The Final Project is a group assignment to enhance students' team work skills. The content should be relevant to either the import-export business concepts or the English language used in the import-export business. The Oral Presentation is also conducted in group based on the Final Project content.

2. For each incidence of lateness 1 point will be deducted. For each unexcused absence 2 points will be deducted. Attendance scores can be reduced for lack of participation despite physical presence.
